- <u>Study abroad</u>: Students have access to rich and diverse study abroad programs through all EcoLeague member schools, including programs in Africa, Asia, Europe, and the Americas.

- <u>Enriched academic programs</u>: Participation in the EcoLeague adds depth, breadth, and diversity to your academic programs with opportunities to develop and offer joint courses,



certificates, concentrations, and modules in areas such as water management, food systems, sustainable communities, and sustainable business.
